If the answer is 'YES' to any of the screening questions, then they should not participate in the session or match. They should then contact the NHS and request a test. The manager or coach in charge on the day should be informed immediately. Before the session or match begins, each participant must hand a completed self-check form to the manager/coach to confirm their check is negative. The forms and the Track & Trace form should be sent in to the club as soon as possible after the session/match has been completed. To avoid doubt, any parent or guardian, travelling to the venue must also self check even if they stay in their vehicle. They do not however, need to fill in a form and hand it to the manager/coach. Any individuals who are subsequently advised to self-isolate and the club MUST be informed of their progress by updating their manager/coach until they have been cleared to resume. 	1	5	5

Cleansing And Sanitizing of Equipment	3	5	15	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Frequently clean training equipment between uses, using disinfectant/cleaning products Frequently clean all objects and surfaces that are regularly touched, such as goal-posts, corner flag posts and any other equipment or kit used in match day situations or training sessions. Football activity equipment should only be shared as and when it becomes necessary. All items of equipment to be decontaminated using disinfectant wipes or by wiping the equipment down with a clean cloth Impregnated with disinfectant Goalkeepers should ensure that they disinfect their gloves regularly throughout matches especially at the start, during breaks in play and at the end of matches.
